

KEEP FIT in ENGLISH, 2025-26

CURSO MONOGRÁFICO de MANTENIMIENTO

OBJECTIVES:

The main aims of this course are:

.-Give students who have a level of B1 in English (or higher) the opportunity to keep contact with the language and consolidate their knowledge, without the constraints of enrolling in an official course.

.-Get familiar with the Anglo-Saxon countries and with English as a living language, product of a melting pot of cultures, which has made it unique. This year we will focus mainly on Ireland.

GUIDELINES TO THE COURSE:

The classes will focus mainly on the listening, / speaking skills through constant practice (and also the writing skills, for those interested in further practice at home).


Normally a DVD (but occasionally a recording, a written text and/or a topic for discussion) will be the starting point to a number of practical activities, which will make students interact.

As for grammar, vocabulary and phonetics, they will not be studied as such, following a settled syllabus. However, we will concentrate on them when necessary for the understanding/ /production of a particular issue.

All this will allow students to brush up the English they learnt in previous years, bringing forward elements they had almost forgotten, and also to make them familiar with many new ones they have, perhaps, never seen so far.
